

EMIL CALOTĂ VICE-PRESIDENT OF ANRE

Prior to becoming the Vice-president of ANRE in 2012, Emil Calotă has been the Senior Adviser to the President of the Romanian Court of Accounts, position he occupied after being the Mayor of Ploiești City between 2000 and 2008. He started his professional career in 1976 at Petrotel S.A. (Former Ploiești Petrochemical Works Teleajen), where he worked for 17 years as Head of Department, Petrochemical Factory Director and Deputy General Manager. Emil Calotă later joined RAFIROM, the national holding company for oil and refining and petrochemicals as Deputy General Manager, then he joined the Romanian Oil Company as

Director for International Affairs. In 1997 he became Chief Adviser at Rompetrol and in 1998 Deputy General Manager at Black Sea LPG, a US – Romanian joint venture company, working for both until 2000.

He graduated the Polytechnic Institute in Bucharest in 1976, with a diploma in Chemical Engineering. He is PhD in science at the Petroleum and Gas University in Ploieşti. He also holds a Management diploma from the Romanian Management Institute. Emil Calotă took part in several training programs like "Operation of chemical plants" at Mitsui Petrochemical Co. in Japan in 1980, "Restructuring and management of oil industry" at Shell Group in London in 1990 and "Privatization and restructuring of oil companies" at Jackson University in Mississippi in 1995.

He has spent several years as associate professor to the Oil and Gas University of Ploiești, teaching master classes of EU Institutions and Policies.
